Our Timetable

Library

Homework & Reading

As it was last term, homework will be handed out on **Wednesday** to be completed and handed in on **Monday**. Activities will cover a variety of curricular areas and reinforce learning that is taking place in class. Reading times will be shown in your child's reading record, please



remind your child to bring this every day to support further tasks in class. Children will get reading homework every week which relates to tasks we do in

class.

Our learning this term: *Maths*

This term in Maths we will continue to focus on developing and sharing mental and written strategies for adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. We will also improve our skills in data handling and money which will relate to our topic.

Topic

Our topic this term is a comparison study between Scotland and some central eastern countries in Africa supported by https://www.sendacow.org/. We will be improving our thinking, listening and discussion skills and using our topic in literacy, maths, drama, music and art lessons. We will also be aiming to raise money to support the charity. To do this we are planning a Bring and Buy sale. If you are planning on doing a clear out of any old toys ahead of Christmas, then please keep hold of these and they can be brought in to help raise some funds at the sale.

Literacy

This term in Literacy we will be developing our writing skills by covering a variety of genres including recount, reports and persuasive writing.

We will also be developing some new comprehension strategies in reading.
Additionally, we will be improving our listening skills on our work on our class novel as well as improving our talking skills with our discussion on our topic.

Equipment

As I did last term I plan to keep PE kits in class and send them home at the end of each term to be washed because we will require to have our kits throughout the week. Please ensure that long hair is tied back and that earrings or other jewellery (including any watches or Fitbits) are removed or covered with tape for safety during P.E..

It is important that each child has a water bottle with them. These can be refilled during the day as required.

As the weather is getting colder, children should bring appropriate clothing with them and any wellies on wet or snowy days can be removed while in class and PE shoes can be worn.

A well-equipped pencil case is useful in class. This would include sharp pencils for writing and colouring, a rubber, a ruler and a sharpener. Please note "Sharpies" or other permanent markers are not allowed to be used in class.

It is also a good idea to provide an apron or adultsized t-shirt to protect uniforms during Art lessons.
