
## Term 2 – October-December 2018

## **Library visits:**

Library visits this term will be every second Tuesday - 6<sup>th and</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> November and 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> December

#### Topic:



This term our topic is Democracy. We are researching the history of parliament and the structure and roles within parliament. We will also be covering political parties, dictatorship, voting, devolution and the process of elections. In cooperative groups the children are creating their own country and applying their knowledge to create a fair government after anarchy has arisen.



Bikeability training will continue until November 16<sup>th</sup> with an assessment of the skills taught. Children will either achieve Level 1 or Level 2 and will be informed of any areas they need to keep working on.

We will also be looking at food technology including food handling and preparation and a balanced diet in our health and wellbeing context. We will cover seasonality of food and what is available at different times of the year.

### Numeracy:

In Numeracy, we will continue to revise work on the four major operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division) and apply these to other areas in Maths.

We have been looking at measure including length, perimeter and area, weight and capacity. The children have been investigating different units of measurement and conversion between these.

We will move onto money and using the four operations to solve problems within this context.

We will also cover information handling with a focus on analysing and interpreting data and completing graphs accurately.

### **Literacy**:

Reading will take place in class on a Monday and Thursday where children will be involved in group, paired and individual reading. Tasks will relate to their group book or the class novel. Reading books should be brought into class every day.

We would also encourage pupils to continue to read for their own personal interest and enjoyment from a wide range of texts. This can also be recorded in their reading record. This is also being supported during our library sessions.

The class will focus on the language features of poetry including personification, imagery and onomatopoeia. Through our topic activities our writing lessons will focus on persuasion, explanation and discursive tasks.

We aim to teach the skills of debating and will conduct debates on different themes in class.

## **Homework:**

Homework will continue to be issued each week on a Thursday to be completed and returned by the following Tuesday. Activities will cover a variety of curricular areas and reinforce learning that is taking place in class.
