Dear Parents/Guardians

New Children

A BIG welcome to all our new children and their families who have joined us recently. We hope you will enjoy coming to the Nursery and that your child is settling in. If you have any worries or queries don't hesitate to speak to any member of staff. We are happy to help if we can.

Parent Helpers

We would like to offer you the chance if you wish, to come along and help out in Nursery. We ask that parents of children who have only just joined wait till Term 4 before volunteering to come in to allow their child to fully settle in. We have found in the past that some children can get very upset and unsettled if their parents come in too early. This term, parent helpers will be invited in on a Thursday. A sheet will be up for both sessions on the Parents notice board for you to place your name against the Thursday of your choice. This is done on a first come basis.

Winter/Space Topic

Our Space topic has taken off and the children have expressed their thoughts and ideas when planning this theme. The children will have opportunities to suggest topical ideas about things we could see, make and do. We would love to gain your thoughts too, please leave your suggestions on the display board located in the foyer.

World of Work

So far we have been fortunate to have visitors come into the Nursery to talk to the children about their jobs. The children have shown a lot of interest in learning what each job entails. Storyteller Wanted!

In Nursery, both the children and staff will be sharing their favourite books as part of our lead up to World Book Day. From the woodland world of the Gruffalo and the pastures of the Three Billy Goats to Hairy Maclary and traditional tales, the children will be listening to and re-telling many different stories.

We would like to invite any willing storytellers into the Nursery to read their favourite story to the children. If you or a relative are interested, for example a Grandparent, please let us know on the door at Pick-up or Drop-off.

Nursery Library

We have mentioned this in previous newsletters but wanted to remind you that we have our own small library in the Nursery and children will be regularly borrowing books from it to take home and share. These books belong to us and not to the public library so please remember to return them straight to Nursery staff by the date stamped on the label. Our books are identifiable by the school stamp on the inside cover of the book. We will visit the public library to provide an opportunity to develop the children's library skills and to listen to stories. We would love feedback on your library book. If you can, please complete the book review enclosed within your child's library book.

Cold Weather Clothes

Please can we remind you to make sure your child has adequate clothing on, or with them during the cold months. This will allow us to be able to go outside to play or go on our walks around the school. We hope to be able to go out in all types of weather, so it is important to wrap them up well. Remember to also include a spare set of clothes (including pants and socks) in your child's bag in case they get wet or need to change.

Just a reminder to check the board if it is the outdoor or indoor shoe sign displayed. Most days the outdoor shoe sign will be displayed to allow us to use the outdoor area more efficiently, however on days we visit the hall or are doing activities within the school the indoor shoe sign will be displayed.

Can we ask that you ensure children have suitable footwear for both indoors and outdoors. There should be no crocs, slippers or heels as this can cause accidents to happen in the Nursery, gym etc. Please ensure all jackets, footwear and bags are clearly labelled.

Profiles

The children are very excited to share their profiles with you and these are available to view on a daily basis in our cloakroom area. Please feel free to take time to sit and look at them and please sign and date once you have finished. We would love to share any comments you have made with your child.

There is also a place within the profile where you can share and record an achievement that you and your child are proud of from home, family or their wider community (e.g. scoring a goal at football, sleeping in their bed for the first time, counting the objects in their toy box etc.) Please feel free to write in what they have achieved yourself or help them to record their own news.

Get Together Cafes

These are held in the Rainbow Room on the first Wednesday of each month where you will have the opportunity to meet other parents. Should you have any requests for guest speakers we will try and facilitate this. In the past we had a parent who is a dietician who gave an informal talk on healthy eating and the parents really enjoyed this.

The aim of these workshops is to offer ideas to support children's learning in a fun, friendly and informal way. Your child's first day at primary school is a big step, however there are plenty of practical things that you can do to prepare them. The benefits of learning outside is endless. Being outside allows the children to express themselves freely and helps the child's development both physically and mentally. There are many benefits of outside play in early years, for example, encourages an active lifestyle, appreciation of nature and the environment, develops social skills, encourages independence and provides more opportunities to experience risk-taking. At Kintore the children experience daily outdoor play and we would like to enhance this by having the entire session outdoors every Wednesday. We will start this on Wednesday 30th January, please ensure your child is dressed appropriately.
