Here are a few activities which you can do when you can't make it to school because of the weather. For each day you can't make it into school, please complete 3 of the following tasks in your homework jotter (try to choose from different sections if possible). Bring in your work when you get back to school... I would love to see what you have been up to! Remember to get outside to enjoy the snow for a while too! 😊

Literacy

- Write or make your spelling words in the snow.
- Read a book and write a review about it. We can share these with each other when we are back together.
- Create a mind-map/brainstorm about a character from a book you are reading. Tell me everything you know about them!
- Practice your joined handwriting by copying out a paragraph from your reading, library or your favourite book.
- Draw a picture of a wintery scene. It might be the view of your garden. Write down a list of interesting adjectives to describe your picture/view.
- Write a creative story about a snowman, robin or elf! Remember to describe the characters and setting. Make sure you have a beginning, middle and an exciting end to your story.
- Write an acrostic poem using the word "SNOWFLAKE" or "CHRISTMAS"
- Write a set of instructions for "How to set up a Christmas Tree". Remember the baubles, lights, tinsel and bossy verbs!

Numeracy

- Practice your times tables – there are lots of great games online at Education City, SumDog and Top Marks.
- Ask an adult or older sibling to write some “Missing Numbers” sums e.g.- $4 \times \underline{\quad} = 16$. You can make this challenging by trying some of the trickier times tables.
- Help an adult to cook or bake following a recipe. You can show off your measurement knowledge here ... take responsibility for weighing the ingredients.
- Make different 2D and 3D shapes in the snow.
- Think of a target number (a two, three or four digit number) and write down all the different ways to get that answer. You can use $+$ $-$ \times or \div
- Write out 12 sums which include adding or subtracting Thousands, Hundreds, Tens and Units (you could even try some with carrying and borrowing).

Other Activities

- Using your favourite Christmas song, create a dance routine which you could share with your friends.
- Wrap up warmly, go outside, go sledging or go for a walk. Listen to the sounds of winter. What can you hear? What can you smell? What can you see? Write about it.
- Design your own super sledge. Draw a labelled picture and write a few sentences to say why you have designed it the way you have and why it is the best sledge. Does it go fast? Does it fly? I can't wait to hear all about these! 😊
- Following on from our interesting talk from the SSPCA, your task is to design a winter nest for an animal. Draw and label it.
- Build a Snowman – don't forget your jackets, hat and gloves. Take a picture or draw what your Snowman looks like.
- Design your own snowflake – think carefully about a beautiful pattern and shape.
